
births, promotions and travel; as well as news on upcoming events, festivals and reunions at the School.



COVID-19

As the second term began in 2020 we knew it wouldn't be a term unlike any other as the learners were challenged with practising distance learning from the safety of their homes as a reslut of the lockdown. The closing of the school and the move to distance learning led to changes in the way teachers interacted with their students - and that was no small feat. At Redhill, our students rely on their teachers not only for academics but also for a sense of stability, comfort and more. The strong relationship between our learning and teachers helped to ensure a successful month of distance learning. In a video shared by Redhill and compiled by its leadership team, students were encouraged to find small ways to stay motivated and to assure them that they were not alone in the journey as their peers and teachers were only a click away. And as in the classics, the 1st of June 2020 dawned and Redhill reopened and welcomed its students back!




Coffee & CONNECTIONS


